Hello,

Thank you for your interest in hosting a UMKC – Applied Language Institute international student. Hosting an international student can be a memorable and very rewarding experience. I would like to take this opportunity to provide you with the basic information about our program.

The length of time a student lives with a host varies with each student. Some students are here for a short time and some for a semester. Some students stay several years. When I contact you about a potential student, I will tell you how long they initially plan to stay. If they plan to stay in the U.S. longer and want to stay with you, this is something they will discuss with you once they arrive.

Most of our students do not have a car, so they need transportation. If you work at UMKC, you can bring the student as you come and go. If you do not, can the student walk or is there an easy bus connection? Their classes in the fall and spring semesters will be from 9:00am and 2:00pm; Monday thru Friday. In the summer, classes start at 8:30am and end at 3:00pm. You will probably come earlier and stay later. They can wait for you in the cafeteria, library, or student union and work on their lessons.

I need to know if you prefer a male, female, or either. You have the option of providing food or not. If you provide food, you will cook dinner and have breakfast food available for the student to prepare. If food is provided the student will pay \$800 a month directly to you. If food is not provided, the student will pay \$500 a month directly to you. In this situation, the student needs space in the refrigerator and cabinets/pantry to store his/her own food.

This experience can be an interesting and exciting opportunity for you to learn about other cultures. Many of our hosts have been with us for five to ten years. Some hosts have stayed in touch with their student after he/she returned home. Some hosts have traveled to visit their former students. This is also a "part-time job" for you. There will be some adjustments and inconveniences. As a part-time job, there is some effort on your part to help the student as he/she adjusts to a new culture and language. Despite this, I can honestly say, that it is a win-win situation.
