Free parking is available on Saturday in Lot 91 located immediately west of the Kansas Union building off Mississippi street.

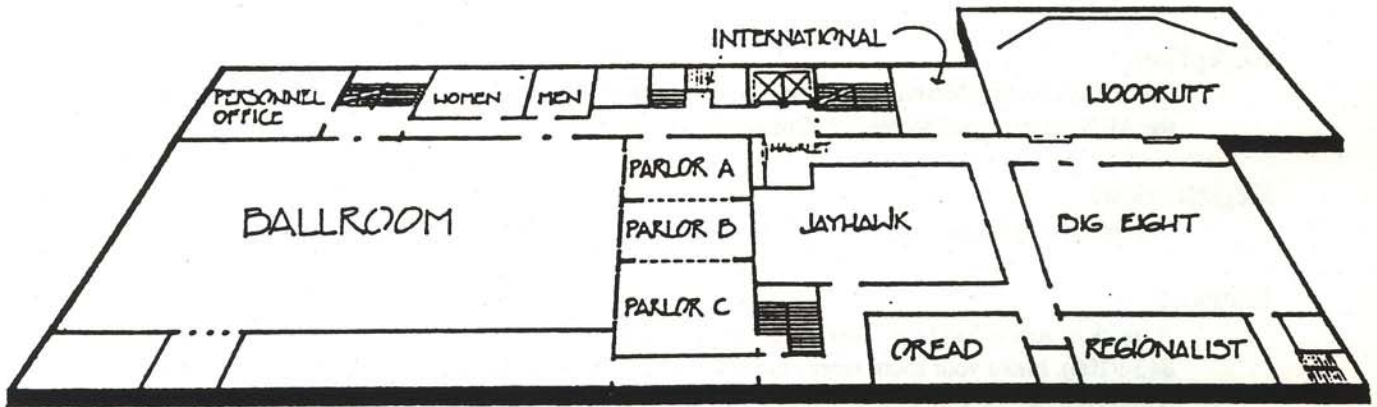
