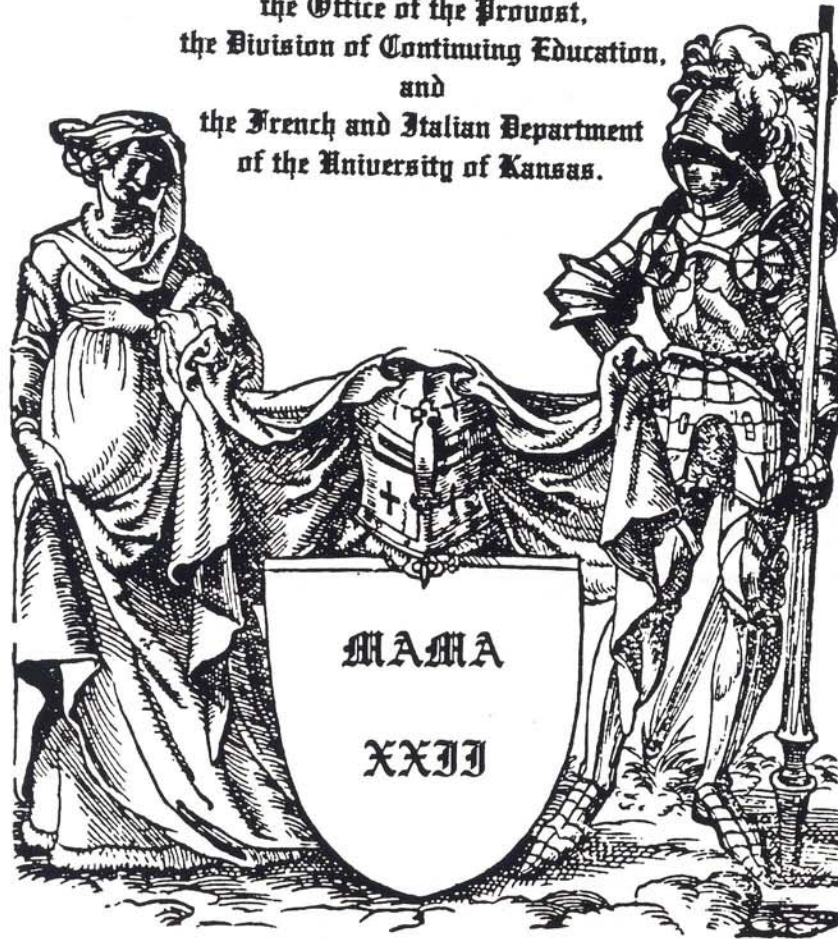

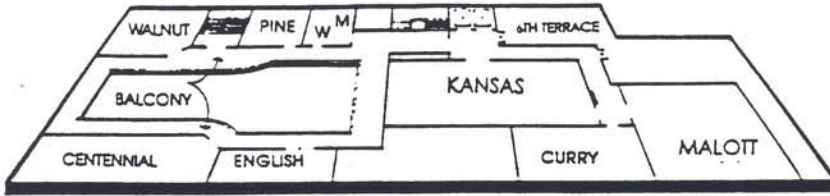

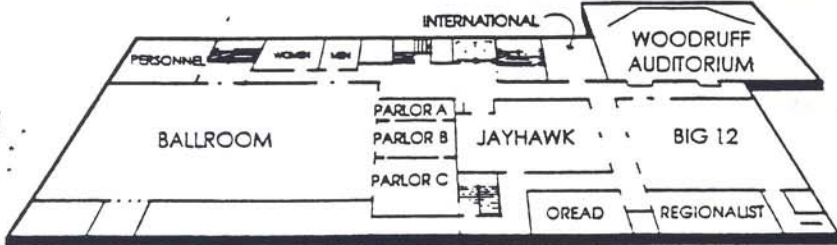
# Kansas Union - Floorplan

1321 Oread (13th Street at Jayhawk Boulevard)

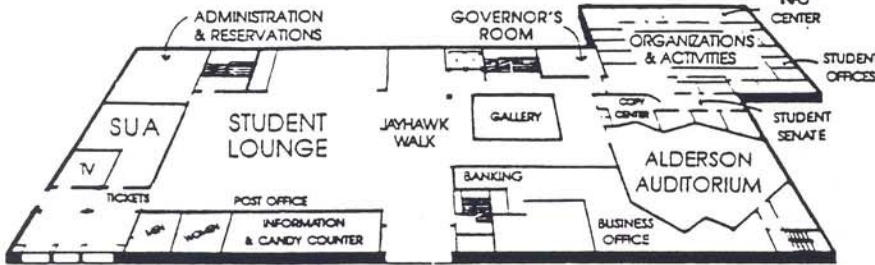

The **local Lawrence Taxi Service** can be reached at: 842-8294 (842-TAXI) - this would be a good way to get to the Union if you are staying off-campus.

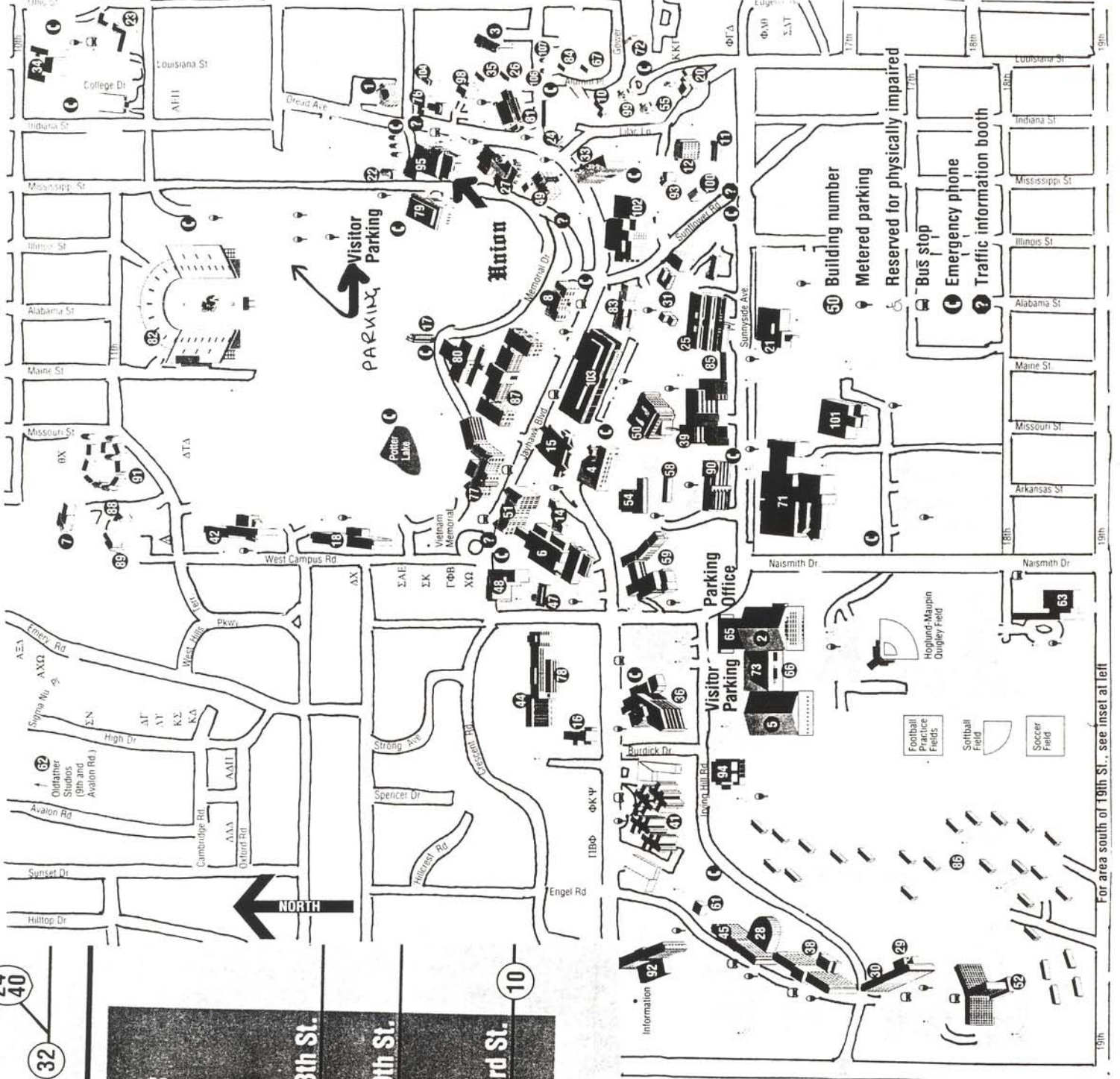
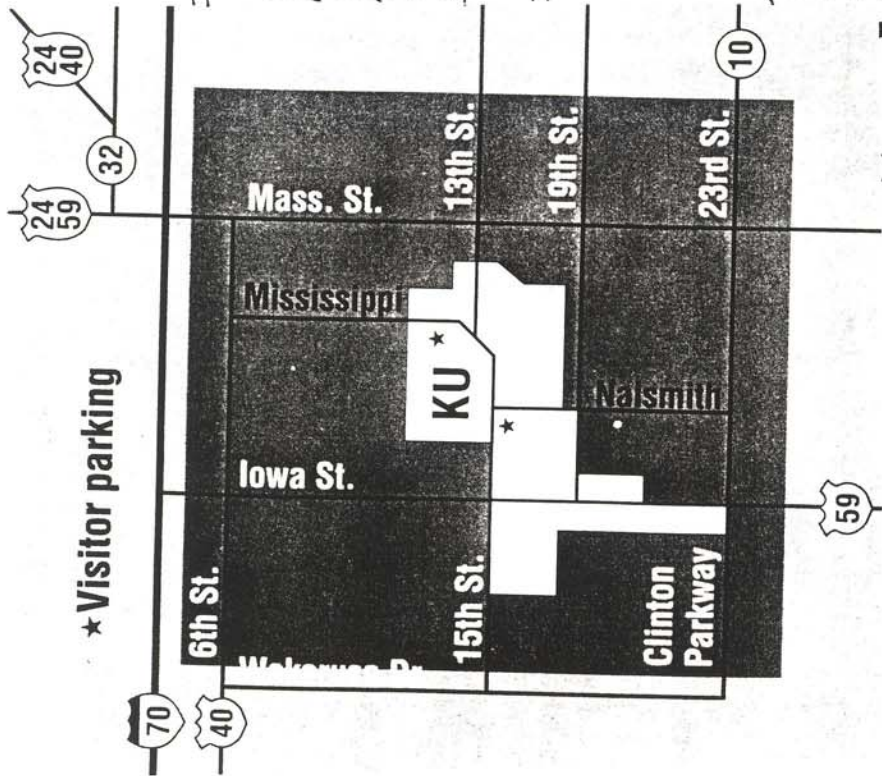

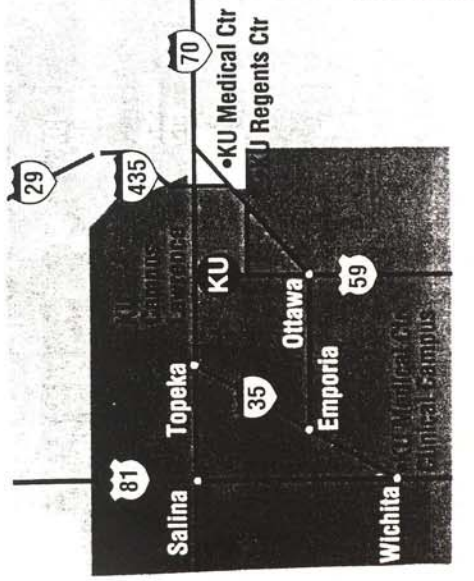
